The theme for the retreat will be "Suffering and the God of Love." From the stomach flu to the loss of a job, from natural disasters to the nighttime fears of children, all our lives are marked by suffering. Yet Christians assert that Almighty God loves us. Fr. Drew will lead three brief meditations exploring this theme, each followed by discussion time in small groups. Emphasis will be given to our common experience of grief, loss, and suffering and the way those experiences shape our life together and our view of God. Copies of A Grief Observed, C. S. Lewis' own journal written in the days following the loss of his wife, will be available for purchase during the summer for those who wish to explore the theme more deeply.

Our retreat will follow the same basic schedule as in years past. One of the most popular features of the weekend has been the time spent in small groups.
